Air Mobility Command Names Malone Construction Project as a Design Award Winner

February 20, 2006: O'FALLON, IL— The Tanker Airlift Control Center (TACC) at Scott Air Force Base was recently named as a winner in the 2006 Air Mobility Command Design Awards Program.
